Guidelines:

In order to receive a Posted Road Permit, applicants must first complete an Application For Permit To Operate On a Posted Way. These applications are available at the Department of Public Works and Public Safety Building. Completed forms must be submitted to the Public Works Director for approval.

The Public Works Director, or his designee, have the authority to approve each application. Once approved, the applicant will be placed on a Pre-qualified List. This List will be kept at the Public Works Department and the Dispatch Office located within the Public Safety Building. No permit will be issued without the applicant being on this Pre-Qualified List or the approval of the Public Works Director, or his designee.

Permits will be issued from the Dispatch Office. If parties interested in obtaining a permit are not on the Pre-Qualified List, they must obtain their permits directly from the Public Works Director, or his designee.

Permits will be issued at the discretion of the Public Works Director based on forecasted weather conditions, temperatures, and road conditions.

The Town of Freeport reserves the right to rescind permits due to changes in weather and road conditions.

The permit to be issued is only for the vehicle owner or operator.

Permits can be issued no earlier than 7:00 p.m., the evening prior to the effective date of the permit.

Permits will be issued for time periods not to exceed forty-eight (48) hours.

The issuance of a permit may be denied if the Public Works Director determines the proposed use could reasonably harm or cause damage to the Town Way.

The cost of each permit is \$15.00, which can be paid for at the time the permit is issued or can be billed by Department of Public Works.

No Permits will be issued: When night time temperatures exceed 30 degrees Fahrenheit.

Other Conditions:

Permitted vehicles may be required to reduce the weight of loads.

Permittee Responsibilities/Damage:

If the Public Works Director has evidence that the permittee has caused damage to the roads, the permittee will be responsible for providing the full cost to repair the damage. No future permits will be issued until this damage is fully repaired.
