

GRAND OPENING CELEBRATION!



You are invited! The towns of Windham, Gorham, Standish, and the Maine Department of Transportation invite you to come celebrate the opening of the 5.7 mile [Mountain Division Multi-Use Trail](#), connecting Route 202 in Windham's South Windham Village, including a scenic bicycle and pedestrian bridge over the Presumpscot River, a loop trail connecting Shaw Park, through Gorham to the Otter Ponds Scenic Area, and Sebago Lake Village in Standish.

This trail is now paved and open for use for bicyclists, pedestrians, equestrians, walkers, strollers, in-line skating, etc. The trail is 10 foot wide, scenic and connects the three communities. This is the first section paved and open of the long term vision of the Mountain Division Alliance to connect Portland to Fryeburg with Rail and Bicycle and Pedestrian Connections.

Time: 10:00 AM

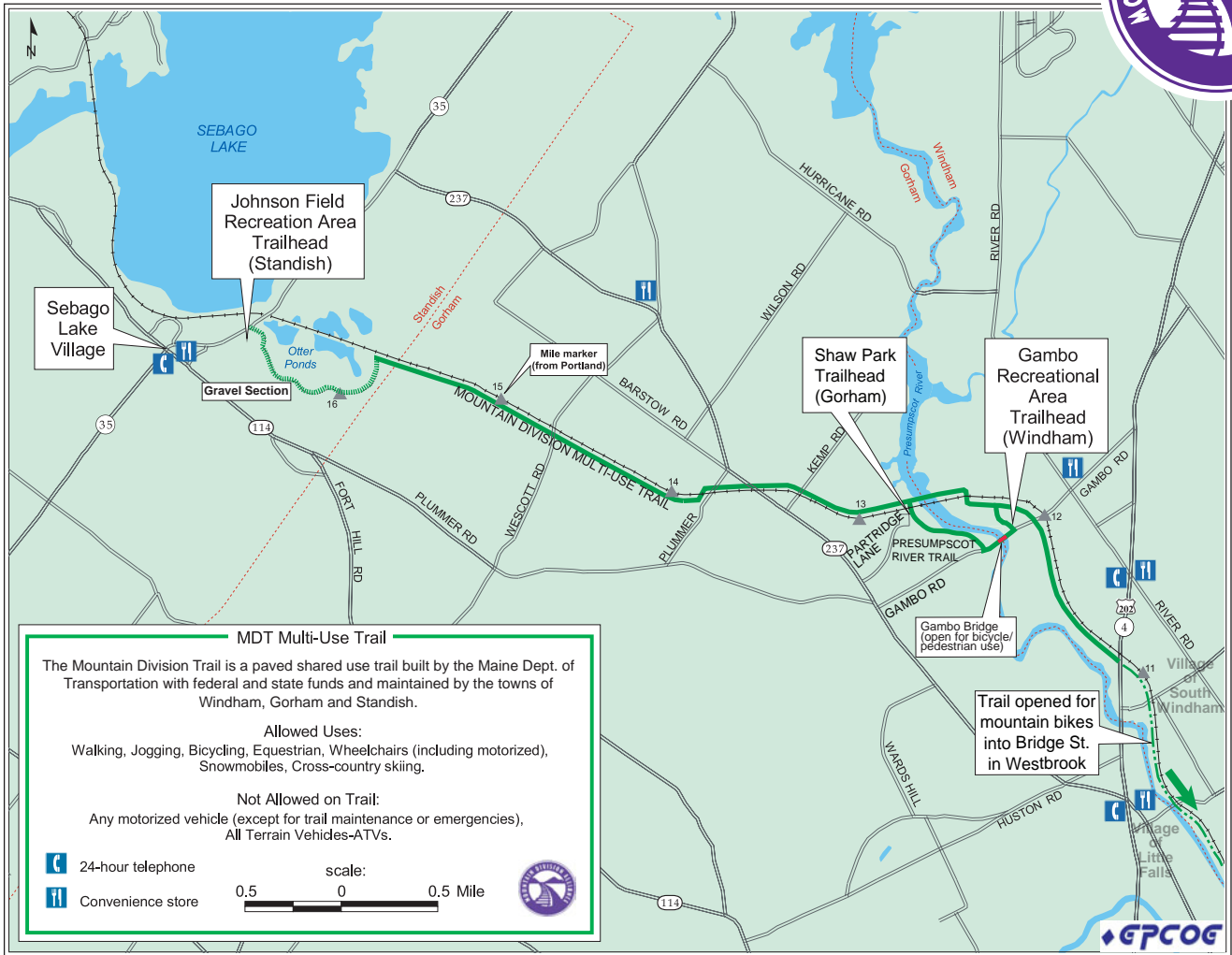
Date: October 20th Rain or Shine
